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INTRODUCTION AND BACKGROUND

Bellefontaine Neighbors engaged SWT Design in the summer of 2015 to conduct a parks needs assessment for the city parks system. Based on the findings of this assessment and the direction of the City Park Board, SWT Design has been further engaged to develop a park master plan for Bissell Hills Park. The master plan spelled out in the following pages is a product of a collaborative process involving the community, city representatives and the design team. Included in this master plan document is a summary of feedback received from the community, a series of concept plans, the final master plan and an opinion of probable construction cost for the implementation of the master plan.

Bissell Hills Park is approximately 4.4 acres in size and located at 10237 Ashbrook Dr. Bissell Hills is a popular destination for residents of the adjacent neighborhood. Currently the park features a softball field, two tennis courts, a playground and a shelter with restrooms.

PUBLIC ENGAGEMENT

Public engagement was a critical component throughout the master planning process. At three strategic points throughout the planning process the design team engaged the public and the Park Board. Regular coordination with the Parks Director was further key to the development of this plan.

Public Meeting #1

Based on the findings of the parks needs assessment performed in 2015, the design team presented 3 concepts to the public at an open house event held at the park on the evening of March 15th, 2016. At this meeting community members were given an overview of the needs assessment findings and the proposed concepts. Attendees were asked to provide feedback on elements of the existing park and the proposed concepts. Elements they found most appealing for the park were identified by placing a sticker over the images on boards presented for each concept. This feedback provided a snapshot of the community's vision for the park and valuable guidance for the design team in development of the final concept for the park.

Online Survey

Concurrent with Public Meeting #1 an online survey was opened to the public. This survey allowed members of the community unable to attend the first public meeting to provide insight as to their vision for the park. Furthermore the survey allowed for more detailed elaboration of feedback provided during the public meeting by providing space for written responses.

Public Meeting #2

Once feedback from the first public open house and the online survey was combined with the findings of the design team to create a revised concept plan, a second public open house was held. Once again this open house was held at Bissell Hills Park and the community was invited to review the final concept plan. The second open house took place on June 21st 2016. Attendees were given the opportunity to write or sketch suggestions for revisions to the final plan. In this case a majority of the feedback received was supportive of the final concept rather than revisionary in nature.



CONCEPT PLANS

Process

In order to understand the vision of the community for Bissell Hills park the design team developed three concept plans based on input received in the need assessment plan to gather community feedback. These plans were presented with concept imagery strategically selected to offer a variety of design vernacular. The three concepts were developed with an idea of low, medium and high impact design to the site. Concept 'A' is generally an improved version of the existing park program. Concept 'B' embraces the current program but expands on the elements in layout and execution. Concept 'C' reflects a near total break from the existing program and a drastic change to the nature of the park. Presenting a variety of elements and layouts enabled the design team to narrow down a program and design aesthetic that reflects the communities long term vision of Bissell Hills Park. Elements of each concept can be detected in the final master plan, illustrating the importance of community input in the design process.

Concept A - Renovation

Concept 'A' took an approach to design rooted in the renovation and improvement of existing features in the park and generally keeping the spatial relationships of the park intact. Key elements of this concept include a softball overlay, and improved playground, and a multi-sport court overlay in place of the existing tennis courts. The shelter in this concept pays homage to the linear design of the

existing park structure and is located in the same space. Changes include two covered patios separated by shared restrooms to allow multiple events to occupy the shelter as well as an open air plaza looking onto the softball fields.

Concept B - Destination

Concept 'B' retained some key program elements from the existing park program including the playground and shelter. However, unlike concept 'A', concept 'B' reflects a totally new vision for these park elements. In this concept the playground begins to reflect a destination style of play that is bisected by a dry-stream feature. Furthermore, the linear shelter is replaced by an open pavilion style of architecture. Concept 'B' replaces the existing tennis courts with a basketball court and the softball field is reprogrammed as flexible open space with a loop trail. Concept 'B' places great emphasis on the park experience for the entire community balancing destination play with flexible passive recreation.

Concept C - Nature

Concept 'C' illustrates the most drastic change from the existing park program at Bissell Hills Park. This concept redefines Bissell Hills park as a natural space within the neighborhood. An open air shelter and nature playground are nestled into a naturalized open space with both paved and soft trails.

FINAL MASTER PLAN

Overall

The final master plan for Bissell Hills Park is a plan that encompasses the vision of the community combined with strategic planning and design. Elements from each of the three concept plans and the existing park can be found in the final plan. The end product is a dynamic park that will serve not only the adjacent neighborhood but will be an amenity for the entire community.

Destination Playground

Unique play features and programmed rooms define the Bissell Hills destination playground. Driven by an existing sewer easement and an opportunity to incorporate stormwater management facilities to separate regions of the playground we are able to program the playground by age and activity. Regions of the playground adjacent to the park shelter will feature young child play features. Age and intensity of play increase the with distance from the shelter. Zoning the playground in this manner allows safe integration of all age groups on the playground. Separating the playground into distinct rooms allows for a diverse play experience as well. Elements within the playground can include: Iconic climbable structures, water play, nature play, swings and fitness play, and a tot lot for young children. Structures should be selected to accommodate a wide range of abilities. Inclusive design principles should be considered within the rooms of the playground. Existing large trees within the playground area and adjacent to the shelter should be preserved wherever possible and integrated in the new design of the playground and shelter.

Multi-sport Court

Existing tennis courts are replace by a multi-sport court. This court allows for flexible programming within this area to accommodate a multitude of uses including: basketball, soccer, hockey and volleyball. Inclusion of fencing at this feature will allow the city to control access to this facility as needed. This feature should be screened from adjacent residential properties with low earthen berms and dense evergreen tree planting.

Shelter

An open pavilion will serve as the park shelter. This pavilion should have the capacity to accommodate a minimum of 60 people to increase the rentable value. Architecturally the pavilion should reflect traditional design elements including gabled roof and clearstory. Stone cladding on columns and lighting add a level of detail that makes this a truly special space within the park system. Restroom facilities are separate from the main shelter allowing all users of the park equal access to the restroom regardless of the programming of the shelter.

Flexible Space

An accessible loop trail encircles a combination of natural and turf open space. Native pollinator species comprise a band of native plantings that border the north and west edges of the property. Native areas should reflect an oak savanna planting style with large canopy trees scattered throughout. Within these native areas birdhouses to attract native bird species are placed. Seating nodes are placed along the loop trail allowing visitors to engage with the open space of the park. It is important that a portion of the open space remain open lawn to accommodate a plethora of flexible unprogrammed passive recreation activities. This space is perfect for picnicking, flying a kite or tossing a ball.

Entry & Stormwater

The existing entry sign for the park is an important element to the community. For this reason, renovations to the entry of Bissell Hills Park should be restorative in nature and should retain the overall design elements of the existing entry and sign. Adjacent to the entry feature a rain garden will serve as the terminus of a new stormwater management system. Beginning with a drystream collecting water from the playground and park shelter, stormwater is collected from the south portion of the site and ultimately treated at the front of the park in a large rain garden. Interpretive signage to educate visitors on the importance of stormwater management would be a great element in this area.





COST OPINION

Included on this sheet is a general opinion of probable construction costs for the implementation of the Bissell Hills Park master plan. The costs are based on available information obtained by the design team during the master plan phase of work. Costs are based on 2016 construction costs and are subject to fluctuation in the market place. This information is to be used in conjunction with the master plan to establish a logical sequence of budgeted projects to be implemented by the city of Bellefontaine Neighbors.

Conclusion

Next Steps

The master plan process is only the first step in the successful improvement of Bissell Hills Park. Following the completion of this planning effort there are several steps to be taken by the city to continue on the path to master plan implementation.

Formal Adoption of the Plan

The first step in the implementation of the master plan is for the city to formally adopt the master plan as the future vision of the park. Following the adoption of the plan steps can be taken towards implementation.

Project Selection / Phasing

Once the plan is formally accepted the city should decide which portions of the master plan are priority for implementation. Included in this decision must be considerations for sequencing of work so that early work does not impede future phases. Another consideration for the selection of projects is budget. A balance must be sought between the desire of the community for improvements and the availability of funding. An example of this would be the multi-sport court in comparison to the shelter. While the shelter improvements may be a higher priority to the community the cost associated with them may make the development of the multi-sport court a more feasible first phase of work.

Community Engagement

As projects are selected for implementation and design services are engaged to develop construction documentation, park staff and the Park Board should continue a program of community engagement. Support that was gained during the master planning process should be fostered throughout implementation and used to guide implementation priorities and phasing.

Pursuing Funding

A number of funding sources are available for municipal park improvements. The City of Bellefontaine Neighbors should explore viable funding resources based on existing situations while remaining open to new opportunities based on future studies and planning. A list of potential funding sources is included below.

- St. Louis County Municipal Parks Grant (Local)
- Land and Water Conservation Fund (Federal)
- Landmark Local Parks Program (State)
- Recreational Trails Program (State)
- Back to nature STL Grant (Local)
- Community Conservation Grant (State)

Project Implementation

Once specific improvements are selected and funding is identified the next step of implementation is to develop design drawings and engage contractors for construction of the selected improvements.




Public Meeting #1 | Existing Conditions





Public Meeting #1 | Concept 1




