

The Minutes for the Park Board Meeting held on Tuesday, June 20, 2017 at Bellefontaine Neighbors Recreation Center.

Mark Dickerson opened the Park Board Meeting at 7:00 p.m..

Present: Kathy Endorf, Judy Mantych, Dave Cross and Mark Dickerson; Director of Parks & Recreation

Absent: Jane Davis, Tina Swindle and Alderman Don Merz

Mark asked if everyone received the Minutes for the May Park Board Meeting and they were accepted as presented.

A discussion followed concerning the Discover Nature Fishing class held on Saturday, June 3rd near the Veteran's Home and how excited the kids were when they caught a fish. Dave mentioned the kids had a really good time and were very well behaved and polite. Kathy mentioned they were third and fourth graders. A discussion followed concerning the bait and it was suggested to get the small red wigglers instead of the big worms. A discussion followed. Mark asked if Dave and Kathy wanted to teach the next class on Thursday evening since there are only two kids signed up and they said sure. Dave mentioned the next class will be teaching them how to tie knots so they'll need rope and string so they can tie on their own hooks and put on weights and bobbers. Dave asked Mark if he got the permit and Mark said he thought it was in the box with everything else but he'll check with Craig. A discussion followed. Mark said I'll either have Craig bring the gear up or send it home with Kathy. Mark mentioned Rich Pflueger or John Jordan may show up. A discussion followed.

Mark mentioned putting in for \$40,000.00 for Bissell Hills Park. I went to a meeting to write the Grant to get the money. I asked the Mayor and he said the Budget hasn't passed yet but go ahead and set up for the first faze. With \$450,000.00 we should be able to do the demo, build the pavilion and restrooms and do some of the sidewalk. We won't be able to do a Multi-Sports Complex or the splash pad or a number of other things. The Conservation Department may be interested in giving us some money so we can consider putting in some native grasses and trees. We may be able to get a 50% match with the Conservation Department for close to \$40,000.00. A discussion followed. This grant is due in August so hopefully we'll put something together and get enough money to do the pavilion and restrooms and demo the tennis court and the storage area.

Judy Mantych reported she and Amy Mulholland went to the Solar Expo on Saturday and it was packed. They were offering mug/travel cups for \$2.00 or 3 for \$5.00. A lot of municipalities were there as well as school districts. A discussion followed. Mark mentioned possibly sending a flier out by the middle of July and for \$6.00 per person they could get a Hotdog, Burger or Brat and paper bags with Sun Chips, Starbursts and Moon Pies. Judy mentioned our Logo will be "Don't sit in the dark by Yourself." We thought we'd hit the church bulletins in the Bellefontaine area, put it on the electric sign as well as the City website. A discussion followed. Judy said she found a resource on line so we can get the glasses for 50 cents a pair. A discussion followed. We thought about taking reservations starting July 17th. The eclipse starts at 11:15 a.m. with the total eclipse at 1:15 p.m. and it will only last about a minute and 30 seconds but it will go until about 2:43 p.m. The participants will be able to watch from the pool deck or we can open the Gym door so you can go out from there. A discussion followed including the fact that the sun is usually south of the pool.

Kathy Endorf asked about getting a new Bellefontaine shirt? Mark said I'll get you another one and have Kathy call you or put it in the box with the fishing gear. Judy mentioned Amy was going to try to get a telescope from the Library. A discussion followed including all the other areas that are holding events.

Mark reported our new weight room equipment will be delivered on Friday at 10:00 a.m. He asked if we'd sold the old equipment and Mark said I'd be happy if I could get rid of them for \$200.00 to \$300.00 per station. I'd be happy if I could get rid of all of them for \$2,000.00. I'm sure the equipment will need some work. He offered \$125.00 a piece for them. I told him I'd have to get with the Mayor. They'll come take out the existing equipment and put in the new pieces of equipment and give me a check for \$1,750.00. The Mayor said tell them they can have it. So this fall I'll repaint the room and clean the carpet once I have more manpower and time to do it. Mark mentioned each piece weighs 400 to 500 pounds.

The Park Board Meeting adjourned at 7:51 p.m.
