

The Minutes for the Park Board Meeting held on Tuesday, June 19, 2012 at Bellefontaine Neighbors Recreation Center.

Mark Dickerson opened the Park Board Meeting at 7:34 p.m.

The Minutes for the Park Board Meeting held on Tuesday, May 15, 2012 were accepted as presented.

Mark Dickerson reported the plastering in the racquetball court is finished. We still have to paint but it looks a lot nicer.

Mark Dickerson mentioned the first Adult Pool Night and the Family Golf Night were held on Friday, June 15th and asked if anyone on the Park Board attended. Kathy Endorf mentioned she was there. Mark said there was a small crowd for the Pool Night but they had a good size crowd for the Family Golf Night. The next Adult Pool Night is scheduled for July 20th and stated the crowd should be better in July.

Mark stated the carpet samples were mentioned at our last meeting and we will get them.

Mark introduced Susan Harris to the Park Board members and stated she is very interested in teaching a Sign Interpretation Class at the Recreation Center. Mark mentioned since the brochure is already out we can try and see if we can get enough participants to make it worthwhile for Susan and the City. She decided to attend our meeting so if you have any questions I'm sure she'd be more than happy to answer them. The class session will consist of one 60 minute class per week for eight weeks. The class fee is \$140.00 per person and is offered to ages 10 years through adults. Alderman Merz asked if we have anything scheduled and Mark stated it is just in the planning stage. We will have to publicize it on the sign in front of the building and maybe put something on the web site. Kathy Endorf suggested sending something to the area schools. Jean Garascia mentioned putting it in the Community News. Mark asked if it is delivered and Jean said it is available at US Bank. Judy Mantych stated she gets it electronically. A discussion followed. Alderman Merz suggested contacting Christ Light of the Nation School and have them put it in their newsletter that will go out before the school year starts. Mark said we'll put something together, try it and see what happens. A discussion followed.

Mark mentioned the East/West Gateway Meeting is scheduled for Wednesday, June 20th from 4:00 to 7:00 p.m. Mark said if you put in for a grant they want someone in attendance. Mark said hopefully it will work out and we'll get the grant for the new bus. The final meeting of the Board of Directors, who will decide who gets the grant is July 25th so we should know shortly after that. A discussion followed.

Mark mentioned the Northeast St. Louis Community Meeting will be held at the Recreation Center on Wednesday, July 11th from 6:30 to 8:00 p.m. They are doing PR work. They are hoping to have around 140 people in attendance. A discussion followed. Mark stated they are looking for citizen input to find out what is needed to improve your neighborhood. A discussion followed concerning meetings for the surrounding areas. Our meeting will include Bellefontaine Neighbors, Glasgow Village, Riverview and Spanish Lake. They will have signs out to inform the public of the location and time.

Mark stated Frank Viviano would like to do a concert. A discussion followed. Mark said we may be able to do it at Klein Park. Jean suggested Mark check on whether he is expecting to get paid. Mark said he'll check. A discussion followed.

Mark asked if any of the Park Board members had anything.

Jane Davis thanked Mark for opening for the holiday weekend instead of just Memorial Day. A discussion followed. Mark stated we got lucky with the weather we've had and it worked out well. Jean asked how pool participation is during the week and Mark said it's been fairly good. We've had decent crowds. The weather has been good with little rain. A discussion followed including the topic of day camp participation at the pool. A discussion followed on the swim fees taken in the first week the pool opened. Mark said at July's meeting I'll have records to compare last year's records with this year. A discussion was also held concerning the snack bar.

Susan Harris asked how often the Park Board meets and asked the names of the Board members. A discussion followed which included introductions.

The Park Board Meeting adjourned at 8:44 p.m.
